Collaborate with CNTR, and our team of seasoned research administrators will manage your study from start to finish—from hypothesis development and aim setting, through proposal writing, grant acquisition, project management, publication, presentation and data sharing. Our support across the entire research lifecycle makes the investigator's job easier and allows you to focus on what you do best—saving lives and conducting research.

We have been a national coordinating center for federally-funded research, first as the National Trauma Institute since 2006, and as CNTR since 2014. Projects under CNTR's management have engaged more than 70 investigators and hundreds of trauma care stakeholders across the U.S., and drawn \$90 million in federal and other funding to date.

Collaborating on Grant Applications

CNTR works closely with principal investigators (PIs) to write research pre-proposals and full proposals in response to federal and other funding announcements.

Managing Large, National, Multi-Site Studies

CNTR serves as the primary contractor, taking on the full array of study management work in order to free investigators and institutions to focus on the research.

Identifying and Recruiting Clinical Trial Sites

Via a partnership with the American College of Surgeons, CNTR has a network of 800 trauma centers across the United States that can be recruited for specific trials based on their patient populations.

Supporting Projects with Regulatory Requirements

CNTR offers comprehensive management of local Institutional Review Board (IRB), single IRB and DoD HRPO human subjects protection reviews.

How to Engage with CNTR

CNTR's Scientific Advisory Committee reviews potential projects for their relevance to the mission, study fit with available sources of funding and funding mechanisms, institutional support, investigator track record, and strength of the initial study protocol.
